An application must, according to the instructions given at the end of the application form, include the following documents:

1. A complete and personally signed application form
2. Certified copy of university degree diploma/certificate
3. Official transcript of Bachelor degree/equivalent, including courses and grades along with information on the grading scale plus translation to English or Swedish
4. Bachelor thesis or other evidence of scientific writing in English, Swedish, Danish or Norwegian
5. Proof of proficiency in English according to instruction
6. Personal information, including two academic references
7. Copy of passport or equivalent

An application is considered complete only if and when all required documents have arrived. Incomplete or late applications will not be considered. Please note that only official transcripts of records delivered directly from your university to Stockholm University Department of Sociology will be considered.

The deadline for application is May 2nd 2007.

1		One copy of the application form duly signed.
2		Duly certified copies of your transcript of records, including courses and grades along with information on the grading scale. If these are in language other than English, Swedish, Danish or Norwegian, certified copies of the original documents and an authorized translation will be required.
3		A duly certified copy of your university degree certificate and/or diploma. If you have not yet completed your studies, please include a written statement from the head of your department, giving your expected completion date.
4		Bachelor thesis or other evidence of scientific writing in English, Swedish, Danish or Norwegian.
5		Certificate or other proof that your proficiency in English is equivalent to a minimum of Engelska B (Swedish and ordic students) and for other students at least a TOEFL score of 550 points (213 computer based; 79 Internet based) OR an IELTS minimum of 6.0 and no modules under 5.0, OR University of Cambridge/Oxford Certificate in Advanced English (CAE), grade A or B or Certificate of proficiency in English (CPE) OR a certificate from your university showing that English was the language of instruction in the courses you attended (3 years full-time studies minimum). Note: Test results must be sent directly from the test center to the International Student Office at Stockholm University (Testing code 0008), and a copy of the test result must be enclosed in your application.
6		Personal information. This part of the application is not allowed to exceed 2 pages (maximum 1 000 words). The information must be written in English and should include: - Curriculum Vitae including schools and professional experience (maximum 1 page) - Letter of motivation indicating your interest and the relevance of your academic records for the programme - Two academic references (Name, position, higher education institution and contact information).
7		A copy of your passport pages showing your identity or a copy of your national ID.
